Grand Junction, Colo.,

December 15th, 1926

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P.M. with President Bell presiding. Those present and answering at roll call were: Councilmen Bear, Meders, Fairley, Moslander, Ellison, and Logsdon. City Manager Thompson, and City Clerk Niles.

The minutes of the last regular session were read and also of the Special sessions held December 7th and 9th, and approved.

Committees from the Elks Lodge, Chamber of Commerce, and Rotary Club were present in regard to the matter of building the new City and County jail building on the Court House Block. Mr. Allen Holcomb read the following set of resolutions, which had been worked out at a joint meeting of the committees.

- 1. Urge the City Council to delay any definite action until there has been an opportunity to thoroughly investigate the matter and determine the best thing to do.
- 2. In any event it was the sense of the committees that if it is at all possible to find a suitable location somewhere else to put the jail, except in the same block with the Court House and proposed new City Hall, this should be done.
- 3. It is recommended that through the City Manager, or otherwise, this proposition be taken up with the City planner, Mr. S. R. DeBoer.
- 4. It is recommended that through the City Manager, or otherwise, the matter of putting the jail on the present City jail site, temporarily at least, be investigated.

It was moved by Mr. Logsdon, seconded by Mr. Bear that the Council concur with the committee in the requests made. Motion carried.

The proof of publication of the proposed ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE CONSTRUCTION OF ANY OUTDOOR AERIAL CONNECTED WITH ANY RADIO RECEIVING SET UPON ANY PART OF ANY OVERHEAD SYSTEM BELONGING TO ANY PUBLIC UTILITY COMPANY" was read. Upon motion of Councilman Meders, seconded by Councilman Bear, the proof of publication was accepted and ordered filed.

The proposed ordinance was then read by the Clerk, and upon motion of Councilman Meders, seconded by Councilman Fairley, the same was called up for final passage.

Councilman Moslander thereupon moved, seconded by Councilman Ellison that the proposed ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE

PROHIBITING THE CONSTRUCTION OF ANY OUTDOOR AERIAL CONNECTED WITH ANY RADIO RECEIVING SET UPON ANY PART OF ANY OVERHEAD SYSTEM BELONGING TO ANY PUBLIC UTILITY COMPANY" be passed and adopted, numbered 409, and published, upon which motion the following vote was cast. Councilman voting Yea, Meders, Bear, Moslander, Fairley, Logsdon, Ellison, and Bell. All the Councilmen voting "Yea", the President declared the motion carried, and the Ordinance duly passed and adopted.

The following Proposed Ordinance was introduced and read:

ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE SALARY OF THE CHIEF OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLO.

Section 1. That the Chief of the Department of Public Works of the City of Grand Junction shall receive the following monthly salary, beginning January 1st, 1927, payable at the close of each and every month, viz:

Chief of the Department of Public Works . . . \$200.00

Section 2. That all ordinances and parts thereof in conflict with this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.

Upon motion of Councilman Ellison, seconded by Councilman Moslander, the proposed ordinance was passed for publication.

The following Emergency Ordinance was presented and read:

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF THE PARK DEPARTMENT.

WHEREAS, Since the adoption of the appropriation ordinance for the fiscal year ending December 31st, 1926, unforseen emergencies have arisen because of the necessary purchase of additional land and the construction of a Municipal Golf Course, at a cost of Four Thousand Seven Hundred Thirty-five Dollars and Eighty-five Cents (\$4,735.85), to date, and

WHEREAS, Receipts from memberships and fees in the amount of One Thousand One Hundred Twenty-one Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$1,121.50) have been collected by the City Treasurer, but can not be appropriated unless authorized by an emergency appropriation ordinance.

THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO:

Section 1. That there be and there is hereby appropriated for the purpose of maintaining the Park Department for the remainder of the fiscal year ending December 31st, 1926, the sum of One Thousand One Hundred Twenty-one Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$1,121.50).

By reason of the fact that the funds in the above named department are nearly exhausted and the work of the department must be carried on, a special emergency is declared to exist, and the City Council finds and determines that this ordinance is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety, and that it shall take effect upon its passage.
