

Grand Junction, Colo.

Feb. 28, 1927.

All the Councilmen having been duly notified, the City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in special session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. with President Bell presiding. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Bear, Meders, Fairley, Ellison, Logsdon, Moslander, Bell. City Manager Thompson and City Attorney Hinman were present.

The Council met in special session for the purpose of considering proposed street lighting contract and revising the general lighting rates of the City. Mr. Rump, general manager of the Grand Junction branch of the Public Service Company of Colorado, Mr. S. G. McMullin, attorney, and Mr. Flower, the rate expert, appeared before the Council and submitted the proposed rates.

Mr. Rump stated that in view of the fact that the street lighting contract expires on February 11th, 1928, and would necessitate a special election in order to get a contract for more than two years, he had decided to offer the revised rates to take effect immediately, if it were submitted at the general City election to be held on April 5th.

The proposed street and general lighting contracts were gone into in detail by Mr. Rump and the City Council. No action was taken by the Council on the proposed rates, as they thought it advisable to take due time for consideration.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion of Councilman Moslander, seconded by Councilman Meders, the meeting adjourned.
