

Grand Junction, Colorado.

March 7th, 1927.

All the Councilmen having been duly notified, the City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in special session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. with President Bell presiding. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Bear, Meders, Fairley, Ellison, Logsdon, Moslander, Bell. City Manager Thompson, City Attorney Hinman, and City Clerk Niles were present.

Mr. Chas. Rump, general Manager of the Grand Junction branch of the Public Service Company of Colorado, Mr. S. G. McMullin, attorney, and Mr. Flower, rate expert were present to take up the matter of the proposed new light rates.

The Council went into executive session to consider these proposed rates, and after due consideration came out and presented a revised program of rates to the representatives of the Public Service Company of Colorado. Mr. Rump stated that he would have to have time to go into these new proposed rates, so it was decided to hold an adjourned session, of the City Council, March 9th, at 7:30 P.M. to go into the matter further.

The matter of giving a portion of the Cemetery to the American Legion was brought up, and decided to wait until Mr. DeBoer came, at which time the members of the Council would go out to the Cemetery and decided what to do in the matter.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion of Councilman Fairley, seconded by Councilman Meders, the meeting adjourned. until Thursday evening, March 9th at 7:30 o'clock P.M.
