

Grand Junction, Colorado

July 6th, 1927.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P.M. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Rogers, Hall, Ellison, Meders, Bear, Moslander, City Manager Thompson, City Attorney Hinman, City Clerk Niles. City Councilman Penberthy was absent.

The minutes of the regular meeting held June 15th, and the regular adjourned meeting held June 29th were read and approved.

Petitions for paving Ouray Avenue from Sixth to Seventh Streets, and Gunnison from Sixth to Seventh Streets were presented by the Clerk. On motion of Councilman Rogers, seconded by Councilman Ellison, the petitions were ordered checked and filed. Motion carried.

Mr. Jos. S. Ingram of the Concrete Products Co. came before the Council and made a proposition to them concerning some pipe which he has for sale. Councilman Rogers moved, seconded by Councilman Hall, and duly carried, that this matter be referred to the City Manager.

Whether the City was to do the graveling in Proposed Paving District no. 18, or whether contracts are to be let was discussed at great length. Councilman Rogers moved, seconded by Councilman Hall, that the City Manager be instructed to make a study of the equipment that would be necessary for the City to invest in, before they could do the work, and report to them as soon as possible. Motion carried.

The matter of selling and shooting off fireworks in the City was discussed. Councilman Ellison moved, Councilman Rogers seconded that the City Manager be instructed to notify merchants that the fireworks ordinance will be enforced another year.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion of Councilman Ellison, seconded by Councilman Meders, the meeting adjourned.
