

Grand Junction, Colo.

July 20, 1927.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colo. met in regular session. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Rogers, Hall, Ellison, Penberthy, Bear, Moslander. Councilman Meders was absent. City Manager Thompson, City Clerk Niles, and Acting City Attorney Tupper were present.

Wm. C. Gray, and Geo. W. Sievert were present and presented a proposed ordinance to the Council pertaining to firms or corporations manufacturing bread and other baker's products, and who are not residents of the City, recommending that they be required to pay a yearly license.

Councilman Penberthy moved, seconded by Councilman Bear that this matter be referred to the Acting City Attorney until the next meeting. Motion carried.

President Moslander appointed Councilmen Hall and Rogers as a committee to confer with the County Commissioners in regard to the matter of back taxes on the proposed jail site.

The matter of sprinkling hours was brought up and discussed. Councilman Hall moved, Councilman Ellison seconded that the City Manager be instructed to limit sprinkling hours from four A.M. to 9 A.M. and from 4 P.M. to 10 P.M. beginning at once. Councilmen voting "Yea", Bear, Penberthy, Rogers, Hall, Ellison, Moslander. All the Councilmen voting "Yea", the President declared the motion carried.

Councilman Rogers moved, Councilman Bear seconded that the City Attorney be instructed to draw up an ordinance changing the registration laws of the City of Grand Junction. Motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion of Councilman Ellison, seconded by Councilman Bear, the meeting adjourned.
