

October 5th, 1927

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock p.m. Those present and answering at roll call were, Councilmen Moslander, Penberthy, Meders, Bear, Ellison, Rogers, Hall. City Attorney Hinman, City Manager Thompson, City Clerk Niles.

The minutes of the regular session held September 21st and the special session September 30th were read and approved.

Mr. J. C. Glassford, representing the Continental Oil Company, appeared and protested against having to restore the corners of 2nd and Main and 7th and Main, where the Continental Oil Stations are located, to their original condition. Councilman Hall moved, Councilman Meders seconded the motion that the Council defer action on this matter until a later time.

The Chamber of Commerce circulated a petition among the various business men regarding the one-hour parking law. In this petition it was agreed that if the business men would park their cars anywhere excepting on Main Street and request that their employees do likewise, the Council would repeal the one-hour parking law. There were _____ signed in favor, and five signed against. The Council ordered that the petition be published in The Daily Sentinel.

City Manager Thompson reported that Mr. Lampshire had offered \$35.00 for tax certificates three lots in Crawford's Sub-division. Councilman Hall moved, Councilman Rogers seconded the motion that the offer of Mr. Lampshire for the tax certificates on Lots 1, 2, 3, in Block 4, Crawford's sub*- Division to the City of Grand Junction be accepted. Upon which motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting YEA, Penberthy, Meders, Bear, Rogers, Hall, Ellison, Moslander. All the Councilmen voting YEA, the President declared the motion carried.

The matter of issuing a license and taking a bond for the J. A. Harrison Auction Yards was brought up and discussed. The Council referred the matter to City Attorney Hinman.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion of Councilman Penberthy, seconded by Councilman Meders the meeting adjourned.
