

Grand Junction, Colorado

January 4, 1928

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Those present and answering at roll call were: Councilmen Penberthy, Meders, Bear, Rogers, Hall, Ellison, Moslander. City Manager Thompson, City Attorney Hinman, and City Clerk Niles were present.

The minutes of the regular session held 21st were read and approved.

Leach Newstnad, 4<sup>th</sup> and Main:

Attorney Lee Burgess was present and spoke in behalf of Mr. Leach, who operates a newstand on the corner of Fourth and Main Streets. Mr. Hamilton, Manager of the Penney store, had made an objection to the stand continuing in business on this corner, and requested that the City of Grand Junction not issue a license to Mr. Leach for the year 1928. The matter was laid on the table until the next meeting of the Council.

Harrison Auctioning:

Attorney Chas. Holmes appeared in behalf of Mr. J. A. Harrison and brought up the matter of auctioneering live stock in the business district. As this matter will come under the proposed zoning ordinance, no action was taken at this time.

Leff Bond:

The bond of Joe Leff, junk dealer, having been approved as to form by the City Attorney, was presented. Councilman Meders moved, Councilman Bear seconded the motion that the bond be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

Broadhead Bond:

The bond of J. E. Broadhead, electrician, having been approved as to form by the City Attorney, was presented. Councilman Bear moved, Councilman Penberthy seconded the motion that the bond be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

Koehler Bond:

The bond of Chas. Koehler, plumber, having been approved as to form by the City Attorney, was presented. Councilman Penberthy moved and Councilman Meders that the bond be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

Saturday P.M. Closing:

City Manager Thompson brought up the matter of closing the city offices on Saturday afternoons. He stated that a great many citizens of Grand Junction were inconvenienced by the offices being closed, and recommended that they remain open.

It was moved by Councilman Penberthy and seconded by Councilman Ellison that the City offices be kept open on Saturday afternoons, excepting during the months of June, July, and August. Motion carried.

It was regularly moved, seconded, and carried that the Council hold an executive session.

At the Conclusion of the executive session, the Council was reconvened in regular session - all Councilmen being present.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, it was regularly moved, seconded, and carried, that the meeting adjourn.
