The Texas Oil company presented a written request to move their metal filling station, tanks, and pumps now located at 5th and Rood Avenue and erect same at the corner of 7th and Colorado on Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, & 5, Block 115; to be allowed to cut the curb on the South on Colorado Avenue, and to erect a canopy over the pumps.

It was moved by Councilman Penberthy and seconded by Councilman Bear that the request of the Texas Oil Company be granted. Motion carried.

Billiard Sunday

The petition of various business men in Grand Junction, requesting that billiard tables be allowed to be operated on Sunday was brought up. It was moved by Councilman Bear and seconded by Councilman Penberthy that the request be denied. Motion carried.

D.R.G. Water rates

Action on the matter of reducing the water rates for the D. R. G. W. Ry. Co. was postponed until the next regular meeting.

Gr. Mesa Res. Stock purchased

City Manager Thompson reported that he had purchased 108 shares of stock in the Grand Mesa Reservoir Co. from Mr. Wolf, executor of the estate of Mary McKay. The purchase price was \$2000.00.

Upon which motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting YEA, Penberthy, Meders, Bear, Rogers, Hall, Ellison, Moslander.
