## Grand Junction, Colorado

## January 16, 1929

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Those present and answering at roll call were: Councilmen Penberthy, Meders, Bear, Rogers, Hall, Ellison, Moslander. City Clerk Niles, City Attorney Hinman, and City Manager Thompson were present.

The minutes of the regular meeting held January 2nd were read and approved.

Goodwill Industries and South Side playground.

Rev. Wahlberg representing the Grand Junction Goodwill Industries, was present and explained the work of the Goodwill Industries to the City Council.

Councilman Penberthy moved and Councilman Rogers seconded the motion that the City of Grand Junction reimburse the Grand Junction Goodwill Industries to the extent of \$1,000.00 for equipment they have put on the South side Community property for playground purposes. Upon which motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting YEA, Penberthy, Meders, Bear, Rogers, Hall, Ellison, Moslander. All the Councilmen voting YEA, the President declared the motion carried.

Rooming House at 561 Colorado Avenue.

A request from Mr. F. V. Ready and Mrs. Anna Myers to operate a rooming house, known as "The Colorado Rooms", located at 561 Colorado Avenue, was presented. It was moved by Councilman Penberthy and seconded by Councilman Meders that the request be granted. Motion carried.

Winterburn Bond.

The bond of Ted Winterburn, Electrician, having been approved by the City Attorney, as to form, was presented. It was moved by Councilman Penberthy and seconded by Councilman Ellison that the bond be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

The matter of the electric light rates for commercial lighting was brought up and discussed.

Councilman Penberthy moved and Councilman Bear seconded the motion that the City Manager notify Mr. Rump that the City Council demands an adjustment in the Commercial lighting rates of the City, and to request that he meet with them at the Council meeting to be held Thursday evening, January 24th. Motion carried.

Herrmann Resignation.

WHEREAS, Mr. Wm. C. Herrmann, was elected and inducted into the office of Justice of the Peace, and has asked to be released from the office of Judge of the Municipal Court, the President of the Council asked for nominations for that office.

Cherrington appointed judge.

It was moved by Councilman Penberthy and seconded by Councilman Bear that Mr. Chas. Cherrington be nominated for the office of Judge of the Municipal Court. Councilman Ellison moved and Councilman Hall seconded the motion that the nominations be closed and the City Clerk instructed to cast a unanimous ballot for Mr. Cherrington for Judge of the Municipal Court. A unanimous vote was duly cast and the appointment confirmed, the appointment to take effect at once.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, it was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Councilman Ellison that the meeting adjourn until Thursday evening, January 24th, at 7:30 o'clock P. M.
