Grand Junction, Colorado

May 6th, 1929

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado met in regular adjourned session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen: Bear, Glassford, Hall, Hirons, Penberthy, Rogers, Sievert. City Manager Thompson, City Attorney Hinman, and City Clerk Niles were present.

The President Pro-tem announced that nominations were in order for a President of the Council.

President elected

Councilman Bear moved and Councilman Glassford seconded the nomination that Councilman Rogers be elected President of the Council and Ex-officio Mayor of the City of Grand Junction. Motion carried.

Councilman Sievert moved and Councilman Glassford seconded the motion that the nominations be closed and that the City Clerk be instructed to cast a unanimous ballot for Councilman Rogers for President of the Council and Ex-officio Mayor of the City of Grand Junction. A unanimous vote was duly cast and the appointment confirmed.

President of the Council, Fred A. Rogers, thereupon took the chair.

Nominations were then in order for a President Pro-tem, to act at any time the President might be absent.

President pro-tem elected

Councilman Hirons nominated Councilman Glassford to act as President Pro-tem.

Councilman Penberthy moved and Councilman Hall seconded the motion that the nominations be closed and that the City Clerk be instructed to cast a unanimous ballot for Councilman Glassford to act as President Pro-tem of the City Council. A unanimous vote was duly cast and the appointment confirmed.

Councilman Penberthy moved and Councilman Bear seconded the motion the meeting night of the City Council remain the same as it has been heretofore, ie; the 1st and 3rd Wednesday evenings each month. Motion carried.

Several matters pertaining to traffic were brought up and discussed.

Traffic amendment

It was moved by Councilman Hall, seconded by Councilman Penberthy, that the City Attorney be instructed to prepare an amendment to the traffic ordinance, changing the speed from 10 and 15 miles per hour to 15 and 20 miles per hour in the business district. Motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Penberthy and seconded by Councilman Hirons that the meeting adjourn.
