

Grand Junction, Colo.

August 21st, 1929

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Those present and answering at roll call were: Councilmen Glassford, Bear, Hirons, Hall, Sievert, Rogers. Councilman Penberthy was absent. City Manager, T. E. Thompson, City Attorney, W. R. Hinman, and City Clerk, Helen C. Niles were present.

The minutes of the regular meeting held August 7th were read and approved.

Councilman Glassford moved that the City Manager be instructed to advise Mr. Chas. Rump, General Manager of the Grand River Valley Railway Co. that it was now apparent from the condition of the streets where the Utah Rock Asphalt has been placed, that it would not give satisfactory service. That if any further material of this kind was placed on the streets that it would be purely at their own risk, as all previous laying of this material had been at their own risk. That unless the surface showed up to better advantage in a very short time, he would be requested to remove all of this material from the streets and to place black top thereon, in accordance with their contract. Councilman Sievert seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The bond of Mr. Joe Quinn, having been approved as to form by the City Attorney was presented. It was moved by Councilman Hirons and seconded by Councilman Bear, that the bond be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

Councilman Hirons moved and Councilman Sievert seconded the motion that the City Clerk be authorized and directed to advertise for bids on the bonds of Alley Paving District No. 2, in the amount of approximately \$20,500/ All bids to be filed prior to September 7th, 1929 at 7:30 o'clock P. M., and to be subject to the creation of the said district. The City reserving the right to reject any and all bids. Motion carried.

Councilman Hirons moved and Councilman Sievert seconded the motion that the City Clerk be authorized and directed to advertise for bids on the bonds of Paving District No. 23, in the amount of approximately \$48,000. All bids to be filed prior to September 7th, 1929, at 7:30 o'clock P. M., and to be subject to the creation of the said district. The City reserving the right to reject any and all bids. Motion carried.

Councilman Hirons moved that the City Auditor be authorized and instructed to advertise for bids for the construction of Paving District No. 23, the letting of the contract to be subject to the creation of the district and approval of the bonds for said district. Said bids to be opened at 7:30 o'clock P. M.

September 7th, 1929, or as soon thereafter as the matter can be taken up. Councilman Sievert seconded the motion. Upon which motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting Yea - Glassford, Bear, Hirons, Hall, Sievert, Rogers. Councilmen voting NO - None. All the Councilmen present voting YEA, the President declared the motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion of Councilman Glassford, seconded by Councilman Bear, the meeting adjourned.
