To the Honorable Members of the City Council, Grand Junction, Colorado.

Gentlemen:-

We hereby make application for a Permit to install two (2) 1,000 gallon capacity gasoline storage tanks on 5th Street, midway between property line and curb line. The center of which is about 40' south of the southwest corner of 5th and Rood Streets. Also two (2) tanks of the same capacity and same relative location from corner on Rood Avenue.

These tanks will be buried strictly according to your City Regulations and as required by your Fire Chief.

We also ask permission to install a 294 gallon Waste Engine Oil Tank in the same relative location between property lines and curb, but this we contemplate locating about 15' East of our south property line between curb and property line.

Enclosed you will please find Drawing No. A-84, giving the location as described.
