RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION DETERMINING AND ASSESSING THE COST OF THE REMOVAL OF WEEDS, BRUSH AND RUBBISH, UNDER ORDINANCE NO. 236, AS AMENDED.

WHEREAS, Under Ordinance No. 236 of the City of Grand Junction, passed and adopted May 18, 1915, as amended by Ordinances No. 386 and 429, it is the duty of each and every person, corporation or association owning any lots, tracts or parcels of land within the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, to once each year cut to the ground all weeds and brush, and to remove the same, together with all rubbish of all kinds, from his, its or their said lots, tracts or parcels of land; and also to cut closely all weeds and brush and remove the same, together with all rubbish of all kinds, from the alleys abutting behind to the middle thereof and from the sidewalk areas, including the parking, abutting in front of all said lots, tracts or parcels of land within said City; and that said duties shall be performed between the first day of July and the fifteenth day of July of each and every year; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to said Ordinance, as so amended, the City Clerk of said City did, within the time provided therein, duly and regularly publish a notice notifying all owners of the property, without naming them, of their duty to cut the said weeds and brush and to remove same, together with their rubbish, from their property and from the streets and alleys, as in said Ordinance provided; and that in default thereof, the work would be done under orders of the City Manager, and the cost thereof, together with the penalties provided in said Ordinance, would be charged to the respective lots, tracts or parcels of land; and

WHEREAS, The hereinafter described owner or owners of certain tracts and parcels of land hereinafter described failed to cut and remove the weeds, brush, and rubbish as therein provided, and within the time and in the manner provided by said notice, and said City Manager did thereupon proceed as soon as practicable thereafter to have such work done and to cut or cause to be cut and removed from such lots, alleys and sidewalk areas all of such weeds, brush and rubbish; and

WHEREAS, The City Manager of said City has made and filed with the said Council a report in writing, containing a clear statement of the work done by him or under his supervision, and the expenses incurred in so doing, showing the cost of such work and the cost for each lot or parcel of land, so that the Council may determine the cost of such work therefrom; and said report has been duly considered by said Council of the City of Grand Junction aforesaid.

NOW THEREFORE, Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction:

Section 1. That the Council finds and so determines that all matters and things prerequisite to the assessment of the cost of cutting weeds and removing brush for the year 1929 have been fully done and performed in accordance with Ordinance No. 236 of said City, passed and adopted May 18, 1915, as amended.

Section 2. That, according to the report of the City Manager, it appears and the Council so determines the fact to be that the several amounts properly chargeable against the various delinquent owners and against each lot, parcel or other tract of land, on account of the cutting and removal of weeds, brush and rubbish by the City of Grand Junction for the year 1929, are as follows, to-wit:

Section 3. That, under and by virtue of the authority conferred in said Ordinance No. 236, as amended, aforesaid, the several amounts set forth and described in Section 2 above are hereby assessed as proper amounts chargeable against the delinquent owners above described and the several lots, parcels and other tracts of land therein described, for the purposes aforesaid. To which assessments shall be added five per centum for the costs of collection and other incidental costs.

Section 4. That the City Clerk of the City of Grand Junction, shall as soon as may be, send by mail, addressed to the owner or owners of each lot or tract of land hereinbefore described at the reputed post office address of such owner or owners, a notice of such assessment, the name of the owner or owners and the amount of the assessment.

Section 5. It shall be the duty of the owner or owners to pay the assessments herebefore described within twenty days after the mailing of the notice herein provided, and in case of his, its or their failure so to do, he, it or they shall be liable personally for the amount of the assessment; and the same shall be a lien upon the respective lots or parcels of land from the time of such assessment.

Section 6. In case the owner shall fail to pay such assessment within twenty days after notice has been mailed to him, it or them, as provided herein, it shall be the duty of the City Clerk to certify the amount of the assessment and assessments herein made to the County Treasurer of Mesa County, or other officer of said county having custody of the tax list for the current year, and to be collected in the same manner as other taxes are collected, with 10% penalty thereon to defray the cost of collection; and all of the laws of the State of Colorado for the assessment and collection of general taxes, including the laws for the sale of property for taxes and the redemption thereof, shall apply to and have full effect for the collection of all such assessments.

Councilman Bear moved and Councilman Glassford seconded the motion that the resolution as read be passed and adopted. Upon which motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting YEA -Glassford, Bear, Hirons, Hall, Sievert, Rogers. Councilmen voting NO - None. All the Councilmen present voting YEA, the President declared the motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the meeting on motion of Councilman Bear, seconded by Councilman Glassford, the meeting adjourned.
