The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, having been duly notified, met in special session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Penberthy, Glassford, Bear, Hirons, Hall, Sievert, Rogers. City Attorney Hinman and City Tomlinson. City Manager Thompson was absent.

Rabies

The object of the meeting was to discuss the matter as to what is to be done with cats and dogs in the City. A few cases of rabies having been reported. Dr. Munro, Dr. Drew, Bruce Brownson, Supt. of Health, Chief of Police Decker, had been requested to be present.

After considerable discussion, Councilman Hall moved and Councilman Penberthy seconded the motion that the Chief of the Department of Health and Parks be instructed to secure and present to the public, through the newspaper, and in other ways, pertinent and interesting data and facts regarding rabies, particularly as regard to dogs and cats, attempting to influence the public with the idea of taking the necessary precautions. Motion carried.

Councilman Hirons moved and Councilman Bear seconded the motion that the City Attorney, in conjunction with the health officers, proceed to draw up ordinances concerning cats and dogs, to be presented at the earliest possible moment. Motion carried.

Councilman Penberthy moved and Councilman Hall seconded the motion that the meeting adjourn.
