The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular adjourned session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. The following members were present and answered at roll call: Councilmen Bear, Glassford, Hall, Hiron, Penberthy, Sievert, and President Rogers. City Manager Thompson, City Attorney Adams, and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

Fulton Pet. So. Franchise

The purpose of the meeting was to further consider the proposed franchise of the Fulton Petroleum Company for furnishing the City of Grand Junction with natural gas. Several changes in the ordinance were made.

The Proposed People's Ordinance was then introduced and read as modified and corrected and it was thereafter moved by Councilman Glassford and seconded by Councilman Bear that the ordinance be passed for publication; that it be published as provided by Charter; submitted to the vote of the qualified tax-paying electors of said City at a special election to be held in said City on the 22nd day of April, A. D. 1930. Upon which motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting YEA - Penberthy, Glassford, Bear, Hall, Hiron, Sievert, Rogers. Councilmen voting NO - None. All the Councilmen voting YEA, the President declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Sievert and seconded by Councilman Glassford that the meeting adjourn.
