

Grand Junction, Colorado

April 23, 1930

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular adjourned session, at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Bear, Glassford, Hall, Hirons, Sievert, Rogers, Penberthy. City Manager Thompson, City Attorney Adams, and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

The Council proceeded to canvass the returns of the Special Municipal election held April 22nd, 1930.

The following is the report shown by the canvas:

TALLY SHEET

We, the undersigned, acting as canvassing board, hereby certify that we have canvassed the returns of the Special Municipal election held in the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, on April 22nd, 1930, and from said canvass find the results to be as follows: that 122 ballots were cast in District "A", that 167 ballots were cast in District "B", that 186 Ballots were cast in District "C", that 319 ballots were cast in District "E", and that 173 ballots were cast in District "D", making a total of 967 ballots cast in all the Districts at said election. The votes for the Ordinance granting the franchise were as follows:

"An Ordinance Granting to the Fulton Petroleum Corporation, a Delaware Corporation, its successors and/or assigns, the right, privilege, and franchise to construct, maintain, and operate a system supplying natural gas, and also to lay gas pipes and mains in the streets, avenues, lanes, alleys, highways, and other public places in the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, and prescribing the terms, conditions, obligations, and limitations under which such franchise shall be exercised."

Councilman Penberthy moved and Councilman Hiron seconded the motion that the report of the canvassing board be accepted and put in the minutes of this meeting. Motion carried.

Fulton Petroleum franchise election

The Proof of Publication of the Ordinance entitled: "An Ordinance Granting to the Fulton Petroleum Corporation, a Delaware Corporation, its successors and/or assigns, the right, privilege, and franchise to construct, maintain, and operate a system supplying natural gas, and also to lay gas pipes and mains in the streets, avenues, lanes, alleys, highways, and other public places in the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, and prescribing the terms, conditions, obligations, and limitations under which such franchise shall be exercised.", was introduced by the Clerk. It was moved by Councilman Glassford and seconded by Councilman Sievert that the Proof of Publication of the above ordinance be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

The following resolution was presented and read:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, From the returns of the election held in the City of Grand Junction, April 22nd, 1930, as shown by the report of the canvassing board just filed, it appears that there were 934 votes cast in favor of and 33 votes cast against the ordinance entitled:

"An Ordinance Granting to the Fulton Petroleum Corporation, a Delaware Corporation, its successors and/or assigns, the right, privilege, and franchise to construct, maintain, and operate a system supplying natural gas, and also to lay gas pipes and mains in the streets, avenues, lanes, alleys, highways, and other public places in the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, and prescribing the terms, conditions, obligations, and limitations under which such franchise shall be exercised."

making a majority in favor of the adoption of said ordinance of 901 votes of qualified taxpaying electors.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the said ordinance was passed and adopted at the said election, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the said ordinance be passed and adopted by the Council and numbered as People's Ordinance No. 22

and that the Clerk be and hereby is ordered to publish said ordinance in the Daily Sentinel, as passed and adopted.

It was moved by Councilman Penberthy and seconded by Councilman Hirons that the resolution as read be passed and adopted, The question being upon the adoption of the resolution, the roll was called with the following result:

Councilmen voting YEA - Bear, Glassford, Hall, Hirons, Penberthy, Sievert, Rogers.

Councilmen voting NO - None.

All of the Councilmen voting YEA, the President declared the motion carried.

Several matters pertaining to zoning were brought up and discussed but no action was taken on them.

Councilman Penberthy moved and Councilman Hirons seconded the motion that the meeting adjourn, to meet at the call of the President.
