

Grand Junction, Colorado

May 7, 1930

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Those present and answering at roll call were councilmen Bear, Glassford, Hall, Hirons, Penberthy, Rogers, Sievert. City Manager Thompson, City Attorney Adams and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

The minutes of the regular meeting held April 16th and the regular adjourned meeting held April 23rd, were read and approved.

Fulton Pet. Co. Accept People's Ord. #22

The City Clerk presented the Acceptance of People's Ordinance No. 22 by the Fulton Petroleum Corporation, and the Council ordered that the acceptance be placed in the record book of People's Ordinances immediately following the copy of the Ordinance.

The following resolution was presented and read:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS The Fulton Petroleum Corporation, as principal, and the Union Indemnity Company, as surety, filed with the City Clerk of the City of Grand Junction, on March 21, 1930, a bond in the sum of \$25,000, in conformity with the provisions of Section 4 of People's Ordinance No. 22, which bond was accepted and approved by the City Council of said City:

Fulton indemnity bond approved

AND WHEREAS Said Council requested Fulton Petroleum Corporation to file a substitute bond containing a provision, in substance, that the right of said corporation to decline to accept the proposed franchise in People's Ordinance No. 22 be limited to the single and only condition that such refusal should be by reason of the failure of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of Colorado to grant a certificate of convenience and necessity to said corporation:

AND WHEREAS Said Fulton Petroleum Corporation, as principal, and Union Indemnity Company, as surety, have filed with the City Clerk of said City such amended, corporate surety bond in the sum of \$25,000, as requested by said City;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED That said substituted bond so filed as aforesaid be and it is hereby approved, and that the City Clerk of said City be and she is authorized to surrender and deliver up for cancellation to said Fulton Petroleum Corporation the original, corporate surety bond as aforesaid filed March 21, 1930.

It was moved by Councilman Glassford that the above resolution be adopted, and Councilman Hirons seconded the motion. On a vote taken on said motion the following Councilmen voted Aye: Bear, Glassford, Hall, Hirons, Penberthy, Sievert, Rogers. All the Councilmen voting Aye, the President declared the resolution adopted, and it was so ordered.

Bond for Murr Harris auctioneers filed

A bond for Murr & Harris as auctioneers, having been accepted as to form by the City Attorney, was presented. It was moved by Councilman Penberthy and seconded by Councilman Bear that the bond be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

Re. Lincoln Park stadium

Messrs. Reed Miller, Harry Burnett, George Gallupe, and G. C. Harbert, members of the Scrub and Scrimmage Clubs, appeared before the Council, in the interest of a stadium to be constructed at Lincoln Park. After considerable discussion it was moved by Councilman Hirons and seconded by Councilman Penberthy that the President of the Council appoint a committee of five citizens of Grand Junction to investigate the advisability of building a stadium and to report back to the Council on the means of financing, cost, and to sound out public opinion on the proposition, and to investigate all phases of the situation and whether or not it is advisable to construct a stadium at this time. Motion carried. President Rogers took the appointment of this committee under advisement.

Councilman Hall moved and Councilman Penberthy seconded the motion that the meeting adjourn, to meet at the call of the President.
