The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular adjourned session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Bear, Glassford, Hall, Hirons, Penberthy, Sievert, Rogers. City Manager Soderstrum, City Attorney Adams, and City Clerk, Tomlinson were present.

Tax sale prop.

A request that The City Council abate the interest on outstanding specials covering Lots 31 and 32, Block 1, Lincoln Park Addition was presented. The outstanding special assessments amount to the sum of \$328.38, interest & redemption fees, \$98.50, making the total outstanding special assessments, \$426.88. There are also general taxes against these lots amounting to \$26.56, making the total amount of taxes against this property more than the lots are valued at.

It was moved by Councilman Sievert and seconded by Councilman Hirons that the interest on special assessments on Lots 31 and 32, Block 1, Lincoln Park be abated. Upon which motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting YEA - Bear, Glassford, Hall, Hirons, Penberthy, Sievert, Rogers. Councilmen voting NO - None. All of the Councilmen voting YEA, the President declared the motion carried.

The matter of the petition filed by Heckman & Bonner on February 4th, stating that they would appreciate having the interest on special assessments on Lots 26 and 27, Block 148, abated, was brought up.

It was moved by Councilman Penberthy and seconded by Councilman Hall that the interest, amounting to the sum of \$59.00, on special assessments outstanding against Lots 26 and 27, Block 148, be abated. Upon which motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting YEA - Penberthy, Bear, Glassford, Hall, Hirons, Sievert, Rogers. Councilmen voting NO - None. All of the Councilmen voting YEA, the President declared the motion carried.

Consideration was given to reports from questionnaires concerning Municipal Ownership of Electric Light plants. It was decided to have the information, as compiled by the City Manager, arranged so that each member of the Council might have a copy of same, and give due consideration to the matter at that time.

It was moved by Councilman Penberthy and seconded by Councilman Glassford that the meeting adjourn, to meet at the call of the President.
