The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, met in regular adjourned session at 4:00 o'clock P. M. Those present and answering at roll call were: Councilmen Bear, Glassford, Hall, Hirons, Penberthy, Sievert, Rogers. City Manager Soderstrum, City Attorney Adams, and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

Proposed Water Ordinance

The emergency ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE USE OF WATER FROM THE WATER MAINS OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO, AND TO ESTABLISH RATES THEREFOR", was brought up and discussed.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

\$1.00 per month Service Charge

BE IT RESOLVED that a schedule of rates be embodied in all contracts with consumers residing outside of the corporate limits of the City of Grand Junction, and who are served with water from the Water System of the City, and that said rates be established as twice the meter rates for consumers within the limits of said City. In addition to such rates or consumption charge, a service charge of \$1.00 per month shall be paid. If more than one consumer receives water from a service line which has a master meter, this said service charge shall apply for each and every consumer upon such service line.

Councilman Penberthy moved and Councilman Glassford seconded the motion that the resolution be passed and adopted as read. Upon which motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting YEA, Bear, Glassford, Hall, Hirons, Penberthy, Sievert, Rogers. Councilmen voting NO - None. All of the Councilmen voting YEA, the President declared the motion carried.

Water Ord. #486 Passed

It was moved by Councilman Hirons and seconded by Councilman Bear, that the emergency ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE USE OF WATER FROM THE WATER MAINS OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO, AND TO ESTABLISH RATES THEREFOR", be passed and adopted as an emergency ordinance, numbered 486 and published.

Upon which motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting YEA, Bear, Glassford, Hall, Hirons, Penberthy, Sievert, Rogers. Councilmen voting NO - None. All of the Councilmen voting YEA, the President declared the motion carried, and the ordinance duly passed and adopted.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned.
