

Grand Junction, Colorado

May 27th, 1931

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado met in regular adjourned session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Those present and answering at roll call were: Councilmen Bear, Glassford, Hall, Hirons, Holcombe, Roberts, Sievert. City Manager Soderstrum, City Attorney Adams and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

Proposed Lease - Mesa Air Transport

A proposed form of lease was presented from the Mesa Air Transport, Inc. by which the City of Grand Junction agrees to lease to the Mesa Air Transport, Inc. its municipal airport field until the 1st day of May, 1933.

Previous to this meeting proposed leases for the airport had been submitted by the Mesa Air Transport, Inc., and Douglas Armstrong, et al. It was announced at this time that the major portion of the financial backing for Douglas Armstrong had been withdrawn.

Councilman Hall moved and Councilman Holcombe seconded the motion that the following resolution be passed and adopted as read;

RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED That the proposal of the Mesa Air Transport, Inc. for a lease on the Municipal Airport until the 1st day of May, 1933, in accordance with the form of said lease in duplicate presented to the Council, be accepted and that the President of the Council and the City Clerk be authorized to execute same on behalf of the City.

Roll was called on the motion with the following result:

Councilmen voting AYE: Bear, Glassford, Hall, Hirons, Holcombe, Roberts, Sievert.

Councilmen voting NAY: None.

All of the Councilmen voting AYE, the President declared the motion carried.

Proposed Public Service Co. Franchise

The proposed franchise ordinance of the Public Service Co, of Colo. for furnishing the City of Grand Junction with electricity was discussed and various changes were made in the ordinance.

Hoover Motor Code Bill

Inasmuch as the State of Colorado has recently passed the Hoover Motor Code Bill, it was moved by Councilman Holcombe and seconded

by Councilman Roberts that the City Manager and the City Attorney be instructed to investigate this State Code and make such changes in the Traffic Code of the City as may be necessary to make same conform to the new State Code. Motion carried.

Richmond Bond

The bond of C. A. Richmond, Cement Contractor, having been approved as to form by the City Attorney was presented. It was moved by Councilman Sievert and seconded by Councilman Holcombe that the bond be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Hall and seconded by Councilman Hiron that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
