Grand Junction, Colorado

September 2nd, 1931

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Those present and answering at roll call were: Councilmen Bear, Glassford, Hall, Hirons, Holcombe, Roberts, Sievert. City Manager Soderstrum, City Attorney Adams were present. City Clerk Tomlinson was absent.

It was moved by Councilman Hirons and seconded by Councilman Hall that City Manager Soderstrum act as City Clerk Pro-tem. Motion carried.

The minutes of the regular meeting held August 19th were read and approved.

Request of Western Union to cancel indemnity bond

A letter from the Western Union Telegraph Co. stating that they do not plan on doing any more underground work at Grand Junction in the near future, and requesting that their \$5,000 Indemnity bond be canceled was presented.

It was moved by Councilman Holcombe and seconded by Councilman Hall that the Indemnity bond of the Western Union Telegraph Co. be canceled. Motion carried.

Resolution cancelling Treece Furniture Co. auctioneer's bond

The following resolution was presented and read:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, On the 6th day of August, 1931, under the provisions of Ordinance No. 238, Section 12, an auctioneer's license was issued to T. J. Treece; and

WHEREAS, It appears that said license should not have been issued and that the said T. J. Treece is not an auctioneer and that use of said license was made for a period of eight days and that no further use should be made thereof.

BE IT RESOLVED, That said license be cancelled and the fee paid therefor be returned to said T. J. Treece less a deduction of the \$4.55 for the time said license was in use.

Dated this 2nd day of September, A. D. 1931.

It was moved by Councilman Hall and seconded by Councilman Sievert that the resolution be passed and adopted as read.

Roll was called with the following result: Councilmen voting AYE - Bear, Glassford, Hall, Hirons, Holcombe, Roberts, Sievert

Councilmen voting NO - None. All of the Councilmen voting AYE The President declared the motion carried.

Anderson water request

The matter of the agreement of Walter & Frank Anderson concerning the use of water from the pipe line of the City and the right of the City to use the gates and roads on Anderson's land, was again brought up. Mr. Adams, City Attorney presented a written opinion on the matter, It was moved by Councilman Holcombe and seconded by Councilman Roberts that the agreement of the Anderson Bros. be rejected and they be notified of the Attorney's opinion. Motion carried.

Request to close Main from 4th to 6th during Highway Celebration

The committee on the celebration of the Utah-Colorado road completion requests permission to close Main Street from Fourth Street to Sixth Street including the intersections with Fourth, Fifth, and Sixth Streets for celebration purposes. This will be for Sept. 24th and 25th. At this time they request permission to use spaces, usually used for parking in front of the stores, for the purpose of booths for the merchant himself for these two days.

It was moved by Councilman Hall and seconded by Councilman Holcombe that the City Manager make such reasonable arrangements as may seem expedient to him to grant the request of the Chamber of Commerce as represented by its Committee to close and use Main Street from Fourth to Sixth Streets, including the intersections of Fourth, Fifth, and Sixth Streets during the two days of the celebration, September 24th and 25th. Motion carried.

Petition to pave N. 7^{th}

A petition for paving North Seventh Street from Teller to North Avenue was presented.

It was moved by Councilman Hirons and seconded by Councilman Hall that that the petition be accepted and referred to the City Engineer for checking, together with a report of the frontage of vacant property. Motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Roberts and seconded by Councilman Hall that the meeting adjourn to September 9th, 1931, at 7:30 o'clock P. M.
