

Grand Junction, Colorado

October 12, 1931

City Manager Soderstrum, City Attorney Adams, and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

Seventh Day Church singers

A representative from the Seventh Day Adventist Church was present and stated that they were planning on putting on a campaign in this City, and that members of their Church desired to go into the residential part of the City and sing the old gospel hymns and ask the residents for contributions. The Council members discussed the matter and there were no objections.

Pent. Assembly request to build church basement

The Pentecostal Assembly of God wish to erect a building on 4th & Grand. At present they desire to build a basement approximately four feet above the level of the ground and then roof it. At some later date they will complete the Church. The matter was referred to the Building Inspector and Board of Adjustment.

Report on Police Dept. by Hirons

Mr. Hirons filed a written report on an investigation he had made concerning the Police Department and Judge of Municipal Court in the matter of number of arrests, collections, etc.

The balance of the meeting was devoted to the discussion of salaries and other matters pertaining to the 1932 budget.
