

Grand Junction, Colorado

April 6, 1932

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen: Bear, Hall, Hirons, Roberts, Sievert, and President Glassford. Councilman Holcombe was absent. City Manager Soderstrum, City Attorney Adams, and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

The minutes of the regular meeting held March 16th, and the regular adjourned meetings held March 23rd, 25th, and 28th were read and approved.

Request for Community Service work

A committee from the various P.T.A. organizations presented a petition requesting the Council to provide supervision in the Parks this Summer. The Council explained that, owing to the financial situation, the Community Service Department had been discontinued for 1932, and there were no funds available for playground instructors. After some discussion, it was moved by Councilman Sievert and seconded by Councilman Bear that the petition be referred to the Public Improvement and Police Committee for investigations.

Auditor's report

The report of Ragan & Wiley for auditing the books of the City for the term October 1st to December 31st, 1931, was introduced and read. It was laid over until the next meeting of the Council.

Chickens running at large

It was reported that chickens were running at large in several parts of town. The City Manager was instructed to see that the ordinance regarding chickens running at large is enforced.

Councilman Sievert moved and Councilman Hall seconded the motion that the meeting adjourn.
