

Grand Junction, Colorado

August 3, 1932

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Those present and answering at roll call were: Councilmen Bear, Hirons, Holcombe, Sievert, Glassford, and President Hall. Councilman Roberts was absent. City Manager Soderstrum, City Attorney Adams, and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

The minutes of the regular meeting held July 20th were read and approved.

Application for tax certificates

Mr. Earl J. Rhodes requested that the Council throw off the interest and penalties on tax certificates against Lot 6, Block 2, Canon's Addition. Water main tax on this property amounts to \$38.10, and \$30.92 interest on Lots 6 & 7. At this time Mr. Rhodes wants to take up Lot 6 only.

Councilman Sievert moved and Councilman Holcombe seconded the motion that the sum of \$19.05 be accepted for water main tax on Lot 6, Block 2, Canon's Addition.

Roll was called with the following result: Councilmen voting AYE, Bear, Glassford, Hirons, Holcombe, Sievert, and Hall.

Councilmen voting NO - None.

All of the Councilmen present voting AYE, the President declared the motion carried.

Ordinance Concerning merry-go round

The proof of publication to the Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 8 OF ORDINANCE #238, PASSED AND ADOPTED AUGUST 10, 1915, AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE #347 PASSED AND ADOPTED JANUARY 30, 1924, AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE #397 PASSED AND ADOPTED DECEMBER 16, 1925, was presented. It was moved by Councilman Hirons and seconded by Councilman Sievert that the proof of publication be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

Councilman Bear moved and Councilman Holcombe seconded the motion that the ordinance be called up for final passage. Motion carried.

It was then moved by Councilman Glassford and seconded by Councilman Bear that the ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 8 OF ORDINANCE #238, PASSED AND ADOPTED AUGUST 10, 1915, AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE #347 PASSED AND ADOPTED JANUARY 30, 1924, AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE #397 PASSED AND ADOPTED DECEMBER 16, 1925, be passed, adopted, numbered 495, and published.

Roll was called with the following result: Councilmen voting AYE, Bear, Glassford, Hirons, Holcombe, Sievert, and Hall.

Councilmen voting NO - None.

All of the Councilmen present voting AYE, the President declared the motion carried.

Lead Service prices

The following resolution was presented and read:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Under the terms and provisions of Ordinance No. 350 of the City of Grand Junction, passed and adopted on Feb. 20, 1924, the matter of fixing the prices for the installation of lead water pipe was to be determined by resolution of the City Council, with power to change such prices from time to time as conditions should require; and

WHEREAS, because of the decreased price of lead and copper pipe it is deemed expedient that a change be made in the prices for such installation.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the following scale of prices shall be charged for lead water pipe connections made by the City of Grand Junction:

The above prices include Mueller or equivalent inverted key curb cock and stop box, also new tap where necessary.

The repairing, laying, or construction of service pipes for the distribution of water, connected with the main in the street and

and extended to the stop box inside the curb line of the street in front of property to be served, shall be performed only by the Water Department of the City of Grand Junction, and it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to repair, lay, or construct such service pipe.

Service pipes of suitable size will be furnished upon application to the City Treasurer, at the City Hall and the prepayment of the charges as above written.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That a Notice including the foregoing resolution shall at once be posted by the City Clerk on the Bulletin Board in the City Hall, and that a notice shall be published in The Daily Sentinel by the City Clerk in two consecutive insertions therein, which notice shall contain a copy of this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the foregoing scale of prices shall become effective five days after the first publication of said notice in said paper.

Councilman Sievert moved and Councilman Holcombe seconded the motion that the resolution as read be passed and adopted. Roll was called and all members of the Council present voted AYE. The resolution was duly declared adopted by the President.

Sprinkling hours changed

It was agreed that the sprinkling hours be changed from 5 to 9 A.M. instead of 5 to 8 A. M. and that it be provided further, if the City Manager thinks it advisable after August 15th, additional hours may be provided by the use of hose held in the hand.

Councilman Bear moved and Councilman Sievert seconded the motion that the meeting adjourn.
