The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, met in special session at 7:30 o'clock P. M., all members having been duly notified. Those present and answering at roll call were: Councilmen Bear, Glassford, Hirons, Holcombe, Roberts, Sievert, and President Hall. City Attorney Adams, City Manager Soderstrum, and City Clerk Tomlinson.

Y.M.C.A.

The purpose of the meeting was to consider whether it would be a good policy for the City to acquire the Y. M. C. A. Building, for use as a City Hall, it appearing that it would be impossible for the Y. M. C. A. to continue as they have been doing.

After considerable discussion the following resolution was presented and read:

RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED That the City Council take no further steps looking toward the acquisition of the Y. M. C. A. building for a City Hall, until the Council has been assured that all other prospective purchasers of said building, for community purposes, have abandoned negotiations for the purchase of the property.

It was moved by Councilman Holcombe and seconded by Councilman Glassford that the resolution as read be passed and adopted. Roll was called and all members of the Council voted AYE.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, it was moved by Councilman Glassford and seconded by Councilman Hirons that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
