Grand Junction, Colorado

November 16, 1932

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Bear, Glassford, Hirons, Holcombe, Roberts, Sievert, and President Hall. City Manager Soderstrum, City Attorney Adams, and City Clerk Tomlinson.

The minutes of the regular meeting held November 2nd were read and approved.

C. of C. request same app.

Several members of the Chamber of Commerce were present to request that the Council allow them at least the same appropriation for 1933, as they had in the past, and showing the need for an additional \$200.00. Mr. Lee Burgess addressed the Council in the matter. It was agreed among the Council that at least \$1,000 be appropriated for the Chamber of Commerce for 1933 contingent on the purchase of No-thoroughfare land, otherwise at least \$800.00.

Mr. Coke, member of the Committee from the Y. M. C. A. appeared before the Council and requested that a meeting be called by the Y. M. C. A., City Council, and Chamber of Commerce, and that the public be invited to attend this meeting, for the purpose of working out some plan for the Y. M. C. A. The Council informed Mr. Coke that they would be willing to co-operate in every possible way.

South 5th right of way for new bridge

A request from the County Commissioners was presented by Mr. Soderstrum, in which the Commissioners ask that the City Council secure the right of way on South 5th Street leading to the proposed new bridge to be constructed in the near future by the State Highway Department. Attorney Adams presented law to show that it was clearly the duty of the City to secure this right of way. Mr. Soderstrum was requested to go ahead and at least get an option on the necessary property.

1933 Budget

The 1933 budget was next considered. Mr. Soderstrum was requested to prepare a statement showing just what the City will collect in the ash & rubbish hauling department, this statement to be endorsed by the Council and proper publicity be given to it.

Petition of protest against salary cut

A petition signed by various business men of Grand Junction protesting the proposed cut in salaries and labor, contemplated by

the City Council, and effective January 1st, was presented. It was moved and seconded that the petition be placed on file.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion of Councilman Glassford and seconded by Councilman Hirons the meeting adjourned.
