The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Those present and answering at roll call were: Councilmen Bear, Hirons, Holcombe, Roberts, Sievert, and President Hall. Councilman Glassford was absent. City Manager Soderstrum, City Attorney Adams and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

The minutes of the regular meeting held Feb. 1st were read and approved.

The matter of issuing scrip in payment for some improvement work, and in an effort to relieve the unemployment situation, was brought up and discussed at length. The City Manager was instructed to proceed with working out details of the proposition, and to find out the attitude of the various businessmen over town regarding their willingness to accept the scrip for merchandise.

Inquiry was made of the City Manager as to whether or not the resolution passed and adopted on Feb. 1st calling attention to the fact that the Council demanded an acceptable bond from the Fulton Petroleum Corporation had been forwarded to the Fulton Co. The City Manager reported that he had mailed a copy of the resolution and had received a return receipt on Feb. 6th, but had no further information from the Company.

It was moved by Councilman Hirons and seconded by Councilman Bear that the meeting adjourn until Wednesday, Feb. 22nd, at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Motion carried.
