

Grand Junction, Colorado

May 24, 1933

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, met in regular adjourned session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Carson, Ross, Oates, Boston, Roberts, and President Holcombe. Councilman Hall was absent. City Manager Soderstrum City Attorney Bowie, and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

Mr. H. B. Chessher, President of the Fulton Petroleum Corp. appeared before the Council in regard to the \$25,000 Surety performance bond which their Company had given in favor of the City, at the time the franchise was granted. This bond was written by the Union Indemnity Company, which Company is now insolvent.

Mr. Chessher presented a proposal in which he set forth the terms and conditions of a new performance guarantee.

Mr. E. J. Hubbert was also present.

All of the Councilmen present were agreeable to the proposal but decided to wait until Wednesday evening May 31st before passing it, in order to give the City Attorney time to draw up the necessary papers.

A request for a beer license for Micheal and Grace Stranger was presented and referred to the City Manager for investigation.
