

Grand Junction, Colorado

July 19, 1933

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Those present and answering at roll call were: Councilmen Carson, Ross, Boston, Roberts, Hall, and President Holcombe. Councilman Oates was absent. City Manager Soderstrum, City Attorney Bowie and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

The minutes of the meeting held July 5th were read and approved.

The matter of licensing itinerant dentists was brought up and discussed. City Attorney Bowie submitted an opinion in the matter.

It was decided that the City Manager contact the local Dental Society and attempt to co-operate with them, and request that they submit such particular form of legislation as in the opinion of the City Attorney may be desirable.

Councilman Boston brought up the matter of the confusion in the names of streets on the West Side, stating that it is very hard to locate properties in that locality. Councilman Hall moved and Councilman Boston seconded the motion that the matter of confusion in the names of streets of Chuluta and Plank Avenues, Lawrence Avenue, and other streets, be referred to the City Manager for his consideration, and he to report back to the Council at a later meeting. Motion carried.

The matter of traffic law enforcement was discussed at length. It was moved by Councilman Hall and seconded by Councilman Ross that it is the sense of the Council that there should be a more strict enforcement of laws governing State licensing of motor vehicles, and that the City Manager be requested to get in touch with the proper County authorities with the view to securing stricter enforcement. Motion carried.

Councilman Carson moved and Councilman Hall seconded the motion that the meeting adjourn.
