

Grand Junction, Colorado

August 2, 1933

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Those present and answering at roll call were: Councilmen Carson, Ross, Oates, Boston, Roberts, Hall, and President Holcombe. City Manager Soderstrum, City Attorney Bowie, and City Clerk Tomlinson.

The minutes of the regular meeting held July 19 were read and approved.

Mr. Soderstrum reported that Mr. Luther, Mr. Jaros and Mr. Goodrich, representing the coal dealers having yards within the City, had called upon him requesting that the Council take action toward regulating and taxing all coal haulers.

It was moved by Councilman Ross and seconded by Councilman Roberts that the matter be referred to the City Manager with the request that he secure a copy of an ordinance being prepared in Denver, and that the Coal dealers be requested to submit a proposed ordinance to the Council. Motion carried.

City Manager Soderstrum reported that there was nothing new pertaining to the lining of the reservoir. The State Committee has not organized and appointed the State Engineer, and that nothing further could be done at the present time.

It was moved by Councilman Hall and seconded by Councilman Ross that the City Manager be instructed to advertise for bids for re-inforcing steel necessary for the construction of one unit of the reservoir, with an alternate bid for the lining of the entire reservoir. Bids to be opened at 7:30 o'clock P. M. August 16th. Motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Hall and seconded by Councilman Oates that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
