

Grand Junction, Colorado

September 25, 1933

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular adjourned session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Those present and answering at roll call were: Councilmen Carson, Ross, Oates, Boston, Roberts, Hall, and President Holcombe. City Manager Soderstrum, City Attorney Bowie, and City Clerk Tomlinson.

An emergency Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE ENGAGING IN THE BUSINESS OF SELLING AND DELIVERING FRUITS, VEGETABLES, POULTRY, EGGS, BUTTER AND OTHER MERCHANDISE AT WHOLESALE WITHIN THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, AND PROVIDING FOR A LICENSE THEREFOR, AND FOR AN OCCUPATION TAX TO BE PAID FOR SUCH LICENSE, AND FOR GIVING BOND BY SUCH LICENSEE AND PROVIDING EXEMPTIONS FROM THE PROVISIONS HEREOF, AND PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION HEREOF", was introduced and read. It was moved by Councilman Hall and seconded by Councilman Ross that the foregoing entitled ordinance be passed and adopted as an emergency ordinance, numbered 504, and published once in The Daily Sentinel.

Roll was called on the motion with the following result: Councilmen voting AYE, Carson, Ross, Oates, Boston, Roberts, Hall, and Holcombe. Councilmen voting NO - None. All of the Councilmen voting AYE, the President declared the motion carried, and the ordinance duly passed and adopted.

Several letters and wires from H. B. Chessher were read to the Council by Mr. Soderstrum and Mr. Bowie.

The balance of the meeting was spent in discussing the preliminary 1934 budget.

Councilman Carson moved and Councilman Hall seconded the motion that the meeting adjourn until Wednesday September 27, at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Motion carried.
