## Grand Junction, Colorado

## October 18, 1933

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Those present and answering at roll call were: Councilmen Carson, Ross, Oates, Boston, Roberts, Hall, and President Holcombe. City Manager Soderstrum, City Attorney Bowie, and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

The minutes of the regular meeting held October 4th, the regular adjourned meeting, October 6th, and the special meeting October 10th were read and approved.

The Proof of Publication to the Ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 32 OF ORDINANCE NO. 484 PASSED AND ADOPTED April, 1, 1931, was introduced. It was moved by Councilman Roberts and seconded by Councilman Carson that the Proof of Publication be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

Councilman Hall moved and Councilman Carson seconded the motion that the ordinance be called up for final passage. Motion carried.

It was then moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Roberts that the ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 32 OF ORDINANCE NO. 484 PASSED AND ADOPTED APRIL 1, 1931, be passed and adopted numbered 506, and published. Upon which motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting AYE - All members. The ordinance was declared duly passed and adopted.

The Secretary of the Y. M. C. A. is planning to hold a boy's picnic on Halloween night, on the island the other side of the Main Street bridge. This picnic is for all boys between the ages of 8 and 16. He desired the endorsement of the City Council and the Police Department. All members of the Council thought it would be a fine thing to do, and should be endorsed and have the cooperation of everyone.

Dr. Munro requested that the City furnish \$30.00 for vaccine for small pox for school children. This being about half the cost of the vaccine necessary to take care of the children this year. The Council instructed the City Manager to allow this amount from the Health Department appropriation.

A letter from the Disabled American Veterans was read requesting that the Mayor issue a proclamation setting November 4th as forget-me-not day. The City Attorney was instructed to draw up the proclamation and the City Clerk to see that it obtained the necessary publicity.

Matters pertaining to the itinerant dentist ordinance were brought up. Drs. Gilmore and Beckley were present and discussed

the matter with the Council. It was decided the test the ordinance and find out whether it is constitutional or not.

Several other matters were brought up and discussed.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned.
