

Grand Junction, Colorado

November 15, 1933

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Those present and answering at roll call were: Councilmen Carson, Ross, Oates, Boston, Roberts, Hall, and President Holcombe. City Attorney Bowie was absent. City Manager Soderstrum and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

The minutes of the regular meeting held November 1st were read and approved.

The matter of burning leaves was brought up and discussed. A number of people had complained about the smoke in the evening hanging over the City, and making it disagreeable for people afflicted with asthma, and nose and throat troubles. The Council suggested that the citizens be requested to burn their leaves early in the day, so that the smoke would be cleared away by night, and also that everyone wait until the leaves are dry before burning them.

Mr. Soderstrum reported that he had spent \$22,518.67 of the \$25,000 appropriated for the lining of one-fourth of the reservoir, and that the unit could not be completed without an additional appropriation. The emergency ordinance entitled, "AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE WATER DEPARTMENT", was introduced and read:

It was moved by Councilman Hall and seconded by Councilman Carson that the ordinance entitled "AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE WATER DEPARTMENT", be passed and adopted as an emergency ordinance, numbered 507, and published. Roll was called on the motion, and all members of the Council voted Aye. The President declared the motion carried, and the ordinance duly passed and adopted as an emergency.

It was moved by Councilman Hall and seconded by Councilman Roberts that the levy for 1934 be fixed at fourteen mill (\$.014) for General funds, and that the City Clerk be instructed to certify this amount to the County Assessor, and County Clerk. Roll was called with the following result: Councilmen voting AYE, Carson, Ross, Oates, Boston, Roberts, Hall, and Holcombe. All of the Councilmen voting AYE, the President declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Hall and seconded by Councilman Oates that the meeting adjourn until Thursday evening, November 23rd, at 7:30 o'clock P. M.
