## Grand Junction, Colorado

## November 23, 1933

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colo., met in regular adjourned session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Those present and answering at roll call were: Councilmen Carson, Ross, Oates, Boston, Roberts, Hall, and President Holcombe. City Manager Soderstrum, City Attorney Bowie, and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

It was moved by Councilman Ross and seconded by Councilman Hall that the City Manager be authorized to submit C. W. A. projects within the City of Grand Junction on City owned property, to-wit:

Project No. 1	relaying of water main on Fifth Streets from Grand to Ouray. Installing water mains and sprinkling equipment and turfing the balance of the Golf Course.
Project No. 2	Painting of the buildings in Lincoln Park and equipment of the City of Grand Junction.
Project No. 3	Tearing to pieces an old boiler and using the flues for fence posts at the reservoir; setting the post and repairing the fence at the reservoir; general clean up on reservoir hill.
Project No. 4	Constructing 400 feet of cobblestone wall; general clean up and repair work at the cemeteries.
Project No. 5	Riprapping of the Colorado river from the Main Street bridge south to connect with the old riprapping.
Project No. 6	Tearing down old City barn and replacing with a brick garage.
Project No. 7	Hauling cobblestones from the

	Colorado River to the City yard for a stone crusher, on a work project for transient labor.
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The proposed budget for the year 1934 was next discussed quite fully. Several suggestions and changes were made.

It was moved by Councilman Roberts and seconded by Councilman Oates that the budget be approved as submitted and revised and that a copy of same be the Colorado State Tax Commission. Roll was called and all members of the Council voted AYE on the motion.

It was moved by Councilman Hall and seconded by Councilman Oates that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
