

Grand Junction, Colorado

February 26, 1934

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular adjourned session Monday, Feb. 26, 1934, at 10 o'clock A. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Carson, Ross, Oates, Boston, Roberts, Hall, and President Holcombe. City Attorney Bowie, City Manager Soderstrum, and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

An ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE RATIFYING AND APPROVING A LOAN AGREEMENT DATED FEBRUARY 1, 1934, BETWEEN THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COUNTY OF MESA, STATE OF COLORADO, AND THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, AND AUTHORIZING ITS EXECUTION", was introduced and read by the City Clerk.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Hall that all rules of the Council which might prevent, unless suspended, the final passage and adoption of said ordinance at this meeting be and the same are hereby suspended, for the purpose of permitting the final passage and adoption of said ordinance at this meeting.

The question being upon the adoption of said motion and the suspension of the rules, the roll was called, with the following result:

Councilmen voting AYE: Carson, Ross, Oates, Boston, Roberts, Hall, and Holcombe.

Councilmen voting NO: None.

All the members of the City Council having voted in favor of said motion, the President declared said motion carried and the rules suspended.

Councilman Hall then moved that said ordinance be now placed upon its final passage as an emergency ordinance. Councilman Oates seconded the motion.

The question being put upon the placing of said ordinance upon its final passage, the roll was called, with the following result:

Councilmen voting AYE, Carson, Ross, Oates, Boston, Roberts, Hall, and Holcombe.

Councilmen voting NO - None.

All of the Councilmen voting AYE, the President declared the motion carried.

Councilman Roberts thereupon moved, that said ordinance be finally passed and adopted as introduced and read. Councilman Boston seconded the motion.

The question being upon the final passage and adoption of said ordinance, the roll was

called with the following result:

Councilmen voting AYE, Carson, Ross, Oates, Boston, Roberts, Hall, and Holcombe.

Councilmen voting NO - None.

The President of the Council thereupon declared that all the members of the City Council, duly elected, qualified, and acting as such, having voted in favor thereof, the said motion was carried and said ordinance finally passed and adopted as an emergency ordinance.

It was then moved by Councilman Ross, and seconded by Councilman Carson that said ordinance be numbered 516, that said ordinance, after approval by the President, be published in The Daily Sentinel, the official newspaper of the City, in its issue of February 27th, 1934; and that said ordinance be recorded and authenticated as required by law.

The following vote was cast upon the motion: Councilmen voting AYE - Carson, Ross, Oates, Boston, Roberts, Hall, Holcombe. Councilmen voting NO - None.

All of the Councilmen voting AYE, the motion was declared carried.

It was moved by Councilman Hall and seconded by Councilman Ross that the meeting adjourn until Monday, March 5th, 1934, at 7:30 o'clock P. M.
