## Grand Junction, Colorado

June 20, 1934

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Carson, Ross, Oates, Boston, Hall, and President Holcombe. Councilman Roberts was absent. City Manager Soderstrum, City Attorney Bowie, and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

The minutes of the regular meeting held June 6th were read and approved.

Mr. Soderstrum reported that the First National Bank wished to exchange the \$35,000.00 U. S. Government bonds which now secure the City deposits, for other U. S. bonds.

The following resolution was presented and read:

## **RESOLUTION**

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, that the City Manager be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to permit the First National Bank in Grand Junction to substitute for the U. S. Bonds now pledged as security for the deposits of city funds, under the arrangement set forth in resolutions heretofore adopted be said City Council, other bonds of the United States of equal par value, from time to time as the City Manager may deem advisable; which substituted bonds shall be covered by joint custody receipts, and such other instruments as the City Manager may require, in the same manner as the bonds previously pledged, and to the same effect as if such substituted bonds had been included in and covered by the original pledge arrangement securing the deposits.

It was moved by Councilman Hall and seconded by Councilman Carson that the resolution as read, be passed and adopted. Roll was called upon the motion, with the following result: Councilmen voting AYE - Carson, Ross, Oates, Boston, Hall, and Holcombe. Councilmen voting NO - None. All of the Councilmen present voting AYE - the President declared the motion carried.

Harry Burnett appeared before the Council and protested the continuation of auction sales on lots opposite the St. Regis Hotel. He declared the sales were a nuisance and the noise in advertising and during the sales had at some times caused his guests to check out of the hotel. The matter was referred to the City Manager.

Considerable discussion was had on the matter of delinquent special assessment taxes. President Holcombe appointed Councilmen Hall and Ross to act as a committee to work out some method in which this matter might be solved. The City Manager and the City Attorney to work with this committee.

The matter of large trucks parking on Main and other streets in the business district was discussed. No action was taken at this time.

It was moved by Councilman Hall and seconded by Councilman Oates that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
