

Grand Junction, Colorado

August 15th, 1934

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Carson, Ross, Oates, Boston, Roberts, Hall, and President Holcombe. City Manager Soderstrum, City Clerk Tomlinson, and City Attorney Bowie were present.

The minutes of the regular meeting held August 1st were read and approved.

D. Frank Payne appeared before the Council in connection with some tax certificates which he wished to purchase for a client. The matter had been brought before the Council at a previous meeting. The matter was referred to the City Manager and City Attorney, a report to be made to the City Council at a later meeting.

Mr. R. L. Safley presented an application for a license to sell 6% beer and fortified wines at the Manhattan Cafe at 339 Main Street. It was moved by Councilman Roberts and seconded by Councilman Carson that the license be granted. Motion carried.

The Council discussed the proposition of drilling an artesian well at Lincoln Park. No action was taken, and the City Manager was requested to procure further information concerning the feasibility of the proposition.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Oates that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
