## Grand Junction, Colorado

## September 21, 1934

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular adjourned session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Carson, Ross, Oates, Boston, Hall, and President Holcombe. Councilman Roberts was absent. City Manager Soderstrum, City Attorney Bowie, and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

Councilman Hall moved and Councilman Ross seconded the motion that the City Manager be authorized and instructed to install a twelve-inch drain between the old 13 1/2-million gallon reservoir and the new reservoir, and a six-inch drain along the west and south sides of the new reservoir.

Roll was called on the motion with the following result: Councilman voting AYE - Carson, Ross, Oates, Boston, Hall, and Holcombe.

Councilmen voting No - None. All of the Councilmen present voting AYE, the President declared the motion carried.

Mr. Soderstrum, City Manager, notified Mr. Horner, in the presence of the Council, that the City was about to proceed with the backfilling of Units 2 and 3 of the reservoir up to the present water level, which is approximately five feet above the top of the footer; and that the act of back filling by the City was not to be construed by Mr. Horner as an acceptance to any portion of the work, or as a waiver of any failure of the Contractor to comply with any of the requirements of the contract, plans, specifications, and instructions involved; and that if Mr. Horner had any further investigations to make, that he do so prior to such back filling.

Mr. Tupper, representing Mr. Horner, requested that further discussion of the reservoir matter be postponed until the next regular meeting of the Council.

Mr. Bowie, City Attorney reported on developments in the Teller "40" matter.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Oates that the City Manager be authorized to expend as much as \$100.00 for the purchase of outstanding prior tax sale certificates on the Teller tract.

Roll was called on the motion with the following result: Councilmen voting AYE, Carson, Ross, Oates, Boston, Hall, and Holcombe. Councilmen voting NO, None. All of the Councilmen present voting AYE, the President declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Ross that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
