

Grand Junction, Colorado

Nov. 28, 1934

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular adjourned session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Carson, Ross, Oates, Boston, Roberts, Hall, and President Holcombe. City Manager Soderstrum, City Attorney Bowie, and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

The Mission Theater made an application to install bicycle racks in front of their theater. The Council referred the matter to the City Manager with the request that vacant lots be used parking bicycles.

The budget for the year 1935 was brought up and considered.

It was moved by Councilman Ross and seconded by Councilman Boston that the levy for 1935 be fixed at fifteen mills (\$.015) for General Funds, and that the City Clerk be instructed to certify this amount to the County Assessor, and County Clerk. Roll was called on the motion with the following result: Councilmen voting AYE, Carson, Ross, Oates, Boston, Roberts, Hall and Holcombe. Councilmen voting NO - None. All of the Councilmen voting AYE, the President declared the motion carried.

The fifteen mill levy was set with the understanding that fourteen mills was for general funds, and one mill for Relief Projects.

It was moved by Councilman Hall that the meeting adjourn. Councilman Oates seconded the motion. Motion carried.
