Grand Junction, Colorado

January 29, 1935

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in special session at 4:00 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Carson, Ross, Oates, Boston, Roberts, Hall, and President Holcombe. City Manager Soderstrum, City Attorney Bowie, and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

Owing to the necessity for calling a meeting of the Council on short notice, and each member having been duly notified, it was moved by Councilman Ross and seconded by Councilman Oates that the provision set forth in Ordinance No. 502 providing that notice be served upon the individual Councilman be waived, and that the said call is hereby ratified. All members of the Council present voted AYE. Motion carried.

The emergency ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF TRAFFIC UPON THE PUBLIC STREETS AND HIGHWAYS OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS AND REPEALING ALL OTHER ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH", was introduced and read by the Clerk.

It was moved by Councilman Roberts and seconded by Councilman Boston that the ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF TRAFFIC UPON THE PUBLIC STREETS AND HIGHWAYS OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS AND REPEALING ALL OTHER ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH", be passed and adopted as an emergency ordinance, numbered 529, and published.

Roll was called on the motion with the following result: Councilmen voting AYE, Carson, Ross, Oates, Boston, Roberts, Hall, and Holcombe. Councilmen voting NO, None. All of the Councilmen voting AYE, the President declared the motion carried, and the ordinance duly passed and adopted.

It was moved by Councilman Hall and seconded by Councilman Ross that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
