## Grand Junction, Colorado

July 3, 1935

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Ross, Holcombe, Oates, Boston, Enstrom, and President Carson. City Manager Soderstrum, City Attorney Bowie, and City Clerk Tomlinson were present. Councilman Roberts was absent.

The minutes of the regular meeting held June 19th were read and approved.

A delegation of property owners in the vicinity of the South End Church, 757 Winters Ave. were present and presented a petition protesting the noise and disturbance made by the people attending services at this church. Mr. Bowie explained that there were no ordinances regulating a matter of this nature, but that there were State laws which governed it.

It was moved by Councilman Ross and seconded by Councilman Holcombe that the petition be received and filed, and on the advice of the City Attorney that there are no ordinances covering the case, and it appears from the remarks made that the case should be referred to the District Attorney, that the petition be referred to the District Attorney with the recommendation that he do something. Motion carried.

Applications for renewal of 3.2% beer licenses for Weisgerber, at 346 Colorado, and G. L. Robb for the White Kitchen, were presented. It was moved by Councilman Enstrom and seconded by Councilman Holcombe that the licenses be granted. Motion carried.

A bond for the Denver Electrical Co., electricians, having been approved as to form by the City Attorney, was presented. It was moved by Councilman Holcombe and seconded by Councilman Boston that the bond be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

A letter from Mr. O. C. Lane, in which he protested the noise made by radios owned by J. C. Corson, located next door to his place of business, on Main Street, was presented and read. Mr. Bowie explained to the Council that this matter should come to the attention of the District Attorney. Councilman Holcombe moved and Councilman Ross seconded the motion that Mr. Bowie be requested to inform Mr. Lane that this matter should be referred to the District Attorney's office. Motion carried.

A letter concerning the agreement for the spur track to the C.C.C. warehouse on South Sixth Street, from the Denver and Rio Grande Western R.R. Co. was read. The following resolution was presented:

## **RESOLUTION**

BE IT RESOLVED, That the agreement bearing date of the 20th day of June, A. D. 1935, between THE DENVER AND RIO GRANDE WESTERN RAILROAD COMPANY and the CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, covering the construction of 940-foot spur track within the

east half of the northwest quarter of Section 23, Township 1 South, Range 1 West, Ute Principal Meridian, at Grand Junction, Mesa County, Colorado, in form as just read and attached hereto, be entered into by the CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, and the President of the Council is hereby authorized to execute said agreement on behalf of said City, and the City Clerk is hereby authorized to attest the same and affix the seal of the City thereto.

It was moved by Councilman Holcombe and seconded by Councilman Ross that the resolution be passed and adopted as read. Roll was called on the motion with the following result: Councilmen voting AYE, Ross, Holcombe, Oates, Boston, Enstrom and Carson. Councilmen voting NO - None. All of the Councilmen present answering AYE, the President declared the motion carried and the resolution duly passed and adopted.

It was moved by Councilman Oates and seconded by Councilman Boston that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
