The City Council, having been duly notified according to the ordinances governing the calling of special meetings of the City Council, met in special session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were Ross, Holcombe, Boston, Carson, Enstrom, and Oates. City Attorney Bowie and City Clerk Tomlinson were present. City Manager Soderstrum was absent. Bruce Brownson, Chief of the Department of Health and Parks was present. The meeting was called for the purpose of discussing matters pertaining to the Orchard Mesa Cemetery.

Mr. Brownson reported to the Council the progress that had been made in contacting the various owners of lots in Orchard Mesa Cemetery in connection with the perpetual care program.

He then introduced Mr. Kennetta King from The Perpetual Memorial Fund Association in Denver Colo. Mr. King told of the work of their organization in getting old cemeteries under the perpetual care plan, and stated that they specialized in this work.

The matter was discussed in full and Councilman Holcombe then moved that an agreement be made between Mr. Brownson and Mr. King covering the cemetery situation. Councilman Carson seconded the motion, and the motion was declared carried.

It was moved by Councilman Holcombe and seconded by Councilman Carson that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
