

Grand Junction, Colorado

August 11, 1937

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in special session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were - Ross, Holcombe, Groves, Boston, Carson, Oates, and President Enstrom. City Manager Soderstrum, City Attorney Bowie, and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

Owing to the necessity of having a special meeting of the Council on short notice, and each member having been duly notified, it was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Groves, that the provision set forth in Ordinance No. 502 providing that notice be served upon the individual Councilman be waived, and that the said call is hereby ratified. All members of the Council voted AYE, and the President declared the motion carried.

No free services for Library

Mr. Soderstrum stated that the Library Board have requested an opinion on whether they would be allowed to furnish free library services to people who live outside the City limits. He stated that he had taken the matter up with Mr. Bowie, and according to the State laws governing libraries, a charge should be made for services to people outside the City limits. The Council also felt that no free services should be furnished to anyone who does not live within the City limits.

Mr. Soderstrum reported on bonds which would be coming due within the coming year, and presented a written synopsis of the bond situation. The Council discussed the matter in detail, but reached no definite conclusions.

Mr. Soderstrum also stated that owing to the fact that Mr. Bowie had been so busy the past few months, it had been impossible to get any of the quiet title suits started on properties which the City has foreclosed on. The Council advised him to get in touch with Mr. Bowie and employ someone to help with this work.

It was moved by Councilman Holcombe and seconded by Councilman Groves that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
