Schlangen beer license

Mr. Jas. Schlangen who has recently purchased the Grand Cafe presented an application for a 3.2 beer license. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Oates that the license be granted. Motion carried.

Silmon Smith tax offer

The tax application of Silmon Smith was brought up. He had offered 10% of the face value of certificates on Lots 1 to 12, Block "T", Keith's Addition.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Groves that the City Treasurer be instructed to sell and assign Special Tax Sale Certificates Nos. 14005-6-7-8-9-10-11-12-13-14-15-16 for 10% of the face value of the certificates, at any time within thirty days from and after this date, providing the purchaser and assignee thereof pay or settle the general taxes on the property in question within such period. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried.

P.W.A. wage sale adopted

The following Resolution was presented and read:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado that we do hereby adopt the following as the minimum wage scale to be used in the construction of the Grand Junction Library, viz:

It was moved by Councilman Holcombe and seconded by Councilman Boston that the Resolution be passed and adopted as read. Roll was called on the motion with the following result: Councilmen voting AYE - Ross, Holcombe, Groves, Boston, Carson, Oates and Enstrom. Councilmen voting NO - None. All of the Councilmen voting AYE, the

President declared the motion carried.

The following applications were filed for the office of City Attorney. Jas. Tomlin - Charles Holmes and W. R. Hinman. The Council decided to vote by ballot on all three applications. The following vote was cast;

Mr. Hinman receiving a majority of the votes cast the President declared that he was appointed as City Attorney starting January 1st, 1938, It was decided that he be requested to attend the Council meetings the balance of this year.

Several matters pertaining to the Police Department were discussed but no action taken.

It was moved by Councilman Boston and seconded by Councilman Groves that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
