## Grand Junction, Colorado

## April 12, 1939

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular adjourned session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Ross, Holcombe, Enstrom, Boston, Carson, Oates, and President Groves. City Manager Soderstrum, City Clerk Tomlinson, and City Attorney Hinman were present.

Power Attorney Gene Mast appeared before the Council and requested that the Cities Oil Co. be granted permission to construct additional driveways at 4th and Rood Ave. They wish to have an additional driveway 34 feet wide on Fourth Street. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Holcombe that the request be denied. Motion carried.

Mr. Mast also spoke to the Council on the matter of the use of the tennis courts. He stated that the students from the High School used the courts a great deal and that it was hard for people who worked to secure a court after five o'clock. Mr. Brownson explained to Mr. Mast that new signs had been placed on the courts requesting that students give up the courts after five o'clock. Lighting the courts was also suggested.

Consideration of regulations requiring the pasteurization of all milk sold in Grand Junction was given by the Council. A number of the physicians and dairymen were present and spoke in regard to the matter. No definite action was taken.

The bond of Elmer D. Cole, Cement Contractor, having been approved as to form by the City Attorney was presented. It was moved by Councilman Holcombe and seconded by Councilman Enstrom that the bond be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Oates that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
