

Grand Junction, Colorado

January 17, 1940

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P.M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Garrison, Campbell, Carson, Treece, and President Boston. Councilmen absent - Ross and Luebbert. City Manager Brownson, City Attorney Hinman, and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

The minutes of the regular meeting held January 3rd and the regular adjourned meeting held January 10th were read and approved.

The City Clerk reported that no protests had been filed against the proposed assessments in Combined Sewer District No. 6.

The following entitled proposed ordinance was introduced and read: "AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE WHOLE COST OF THE IMPROVEMENTS MADE IN AND FOR COMBINED SEWER DISTRICT NO. 6, IN THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO, PURSUANT TO ORDINANCE NO. 178, ADOPTED AND APPROVED JUNE 11, 1910, AS AMENDED: APPROVING THE APPORTIONMENT OF SAID COST TO EACH LOT OR TRACT OF LAND OR OTHER REAL ESTATE IN SAID DISTRICT: ASSESSING THE SHARE OF SAID COST AGAINST EACH LOT OR TRACT OF LAND OR OTHER REAL ESTATE IN SAID DISTRICT: AND APPROVING THE APPORTIONMENT OF SAID COST: AND PRESCRIBING THE MANNER FOR THE COLLECTION AND PAYMENT OF SAID ASSESSMENTS". It was moved by Councilman Campbell and seconded by Councilman Carson that the ordinance be passed for publication. Motion carried.

Bonds for Joe Leff and Earl H. VanGundy, junk dealers were presented, having been approved as to form by the City Attorney. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Garrison that the bonds be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

Application was made by Mesa College for a 20-foot driveway to be constructed on the east side of College Place. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Treece that the application be granted. Motion carried.

An estimate was presented, showing the cost of removing street car tracks, resurfacing, and repairing curb and gutter on Main Street from Second to Seventh Street, and also for constructing a storm sewer at this location. Mr. Pace was present and requested that the Council consider this project, not using W.P.A. labor, that so many men were out of work who were not on W.P.A. it was necessary to do everything possible to find work for them.

It was moved by Councilman Garrison and seconded by Councilman Carson that the City Manager be instructed to prepare

plans, estimates and petitions for the complete resurfacing, removing of street car tracks, repairing curb and gutter and constructing storm sewers on Main Street from Second to Seventh. Motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Campbell and seconded by Councilman Carson that the City Treasurer be instructed to transfer funds in the Water Sinking Fund to the Water Working Fund, and the balance remaining in the Library Construction Fund be transferred to the Library Fund. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council present voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried.

Mr. Vail from the Independent Lumber Co. was present again and discussed the matter of securing water for a new addition north of Orchard Avenue and east of Seventh Street.

Several matters pertaining to traffic and to civil service among City employees were discussed.

It was moved by Councilman Campbell and seconded by Councilman Carson that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
