

Grand Junction, Colorado

September 11, 1940

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in special session at 7:30 o'clock P.M., the Councilmen having been notified by formal notice of call. Those present and answering roll call were Councilmen Garrison, Campbell, Boston, Carson, Treece, and President Ross. Councilman Luebbert was absent. City Manager Brownson, City Attorney Hinman, and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

A letter from the committee on arrangements for the Townsend Club Mass Meeting held on September 5th was received and read, in which they thanked the Council for the splendid spirit of friendliness and cooperation which was shown to them. It was moved by Councilman Carson and duly seconded that the letter be accepted with thanks, and filed. Motion carried.

Fred Huebner and Haywood Jones made an application for a thirty-five foot driveway on Third Street and a twenty-five foot driveway on Rood Avenue, to service a filling station to be built on the southeast corner of Third and Rood Avenue. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Treece that permission be granted to Huebner and Jones for twenty-five foot driveways on both Rood Ave. and Third St. Motion carried.

A letter from Councilman Chas. Luebbert was read, in which he tendered his resignation as Councilman from District "B". He has accepted a position at Naturita and will be unable to attend Council meetings. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Boston that the resignation of Councilman Luebbert be accepted. Motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Campbell and seconded by Councilman Treece that Glenn Robb be appointed as Councilman from District "B", to fill the vacancy caused from the resignation of Chas. Luebbert, said appointment to last until the next regular Municipal election. Roll was called on the motion with the following result: Councilmen voting AYE: Garrison, Campbell, Boston, Carson, Treece, and Ross. Councilmen voting No - None. The President declared the motion carried.

It was then moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Boston that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
