Grand Junction, Colorado May 5, 1941

The newly organized City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado met in their first session at 10 A. M. Monday morning, as required by provisions of the City Charter. The following were present - Newly elected members, Ross, Robb, Carson, Boston and Fox, and old members, Campbell and Treece. The newly elected members were sworn in to office by Helen C. Tomlinson, Notary Public.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Boston that Councilman Ross act as Chairman of the meeting. Motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Boston and seconded by Councilman Treece that Mrs. Tomlinson act as Temporary Clerk. Motion carried.

Councilman Carson moved and Councilman Boston seconded the motion that Councilman T. S. Campbell be nominated for the office of President of the Council. Motion carried.

Councilman Robb moved that the nominations be closed. The motion was duly seconded and carried.

Chairman Ross then asked for a vote of all in favor of T. S. Campbell being elected President of the Council for the ensuing year. The motion was put and all members voted in favor of said motion.

Councilman Campbell was thereupon sworn into office as President of the Council and presided during the balance of the meeting.

Councilman Ross expressed his appreciation to the members of the Council for their patience and courtesy during the past six months while he was serving as President of the Council, stating that his eyesight had been failing and he had been working under a strain.

It was then moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Robb that the Council defer making appointments until the regular meeting of the Council Wednesday evening, May 7th. Motion carried.

The matter of establishing a policy on the granting of liquor licenses in the City was brought up and discussed. City Manager Brownson was requested to distribute copies of the analysis of the statewide survey he recently made, and this was gone over in detail by the Council. No action was taken, and it was decided to take the matter up again at the Council meeting Wednesday evening.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman

Boston that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
