

Grand Junction, Colorado

July 9, 1941

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular adjourned session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Carson, Fox, Ross, Boston, Treece and President Campbell. Councilman Robb was absent. City Manager Brownson, City Attorney Hinman and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

A delegation of people, headed by Mrs. Blackmore, owner of the property located at 1045 Grand Ave. were present and spoke on behalf of an N. Y. A. project for girls being located at the above address. Mrs. Blackmore owner of the property stated that she had talked to several in the locality where the girls were formerly located, and could find nothing objectionable to the project. After considerable discussion, President Campbell appointed Councilmen Foxton and Ross to make a canvas of this district and get an accurate consensus of opinion on the N.Y.A. project and report back at the regular meeting on July 16th.

R. E. Tope presented a plea for funds for U.S.O. The following resolution was passed and adopted.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City Council of Grand Junction desires to endorse and publicly commend the high purposes of U.S.O.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that this endorsement and commendation be spread upon our minutes and communicated to the press and to the local officials of that organization.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Treece that the resolution be passed and adopted as read. Roll was called on the motion with all members present voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried. Several members of the Council made donations to the fund.

A letter was read from Peter Couvelis thanking the Council for their favorable consideration of his beer license application. The letter was ordered filed.

The balance of the meeting was devoted to the discussion of matters pertaining to the airport.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Ross that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
