## Grand Junction, Colorado

October 29, 1941

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular adjourned meeting at 7:30 o'clock, P.M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Carson, Ross, Hoisington, Boston, Robb, Treece and President Campbell. City Manager Brownson, City Attorney Hinman and City Clerk Tomlinson were also present.

The meeting was nearly all devoted to the study of the 1942 budget.

Mr. J. S. Ingraham appeared before the Council and stated that there was to have been a delegation of independent grocers present to protest the cigarette license fee, but that they would appear at a later date. He stated that they had agreed to ask the Council to cut the fee to \$10.00 per year instead of \$20.00

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Treece that the mill levy for the year 1942 be set at 15.5 mills, 14.2 for general funds and 1.3 mills for Library purposes. Roll was called on the motion with the following result: Councilmen voting AYE - Carson, Ross, Hoisington, Boston, Robb, Treece and Campbell. Councilmen voting No - None. All of the Councilmen voting AYE, the President declared the motion carried.

It was moved Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Boston that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
